POLICE in Plymouth are appealing for a taxi driver to contact them after he helped the victim of an assault. Officers are looking for the 'distressed woman' in the Royal Parade area between 1am and 1.30am on Monday November 23.

A MAN arrested over allegations of sexual activity with a girl under 18 has been released with no further action against him, say police. Mike West, aged 28, from Plymouth was arrested by police in September on suspicion of abuse of position of trust and sexual activity with someone under 18. He was a leader of a St John Ambulance division in South East Cornwall.

Following a thorough investigation, police now say they have cancelled his bail. A spokesman for Devon and Cornwall Constabulary said: "Police bail has been cancelled and no further action will be taken against this individual with regards to the allegations. "This is because the evidential threshold for prosecution was not met in this case." A spokesman for St John Ambulance said: "He remains suspended until our own review of the circumstances has been concluded."
